

# PHST genitourinary medicine recruitment – final assessment score distribution

The graphs within this document show the distribution of interview scores for PHST recruitment since 2013.

The scores are recorded for each candidate attending an interview, including those that were found not to be appointable.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here. See the pages below for the number of candidates, including the percentage of those deemed appointable and non-appointable, interviewed in each round of recruitment; the range of scores obtained and the mean and median scores achieved across all candidates.


Where details for a specific year or round are not included, this should be taken to mean that the specialty was not participating in a particular round, had not yet joined the nationally-coordinated recruitment process, or there were an insufficient number of candidates to display scores.



The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2025 ST4 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **27**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **89%**: **11%**. Scores ranged from **48** to **93.50** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **79.83** and **82.00** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2024 ST4 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **7**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **57%**: **43%**. Scores ranged from **39.8** to **78.50** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **62.14** and **65.20** respectively.



All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **18**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **94%**: **6%**. Scores ranged from **45.20** to **96** (min and max possible were **16-100**). Mean and median averages achieved were **74.51** and **74.80** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2023 ST4 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 5; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 100%: 0%. Scores ranged from 68.9 to 81.60 (min and max possible were 16-110). Mean and median averages achieved were 76.50 and 76.90 respectively.



All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 17; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 82%: 18%. Scores ranged from 53.4 to 104 (min and max possible were 16-110). Mean and median averages achieved were 81.96 and 85.10 respectively.



All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 1; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 100%: 0%. Scores ranged from 87 (min and max possible were 16-110.3). Mean and median averages achieved were 87 and 87 respectively.



All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **7**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **86%**: **14%**. Scores ranged from **53.8** – **87.05** (min and max possible were 16-110.3). Mean and median averages achieved were **68.58** and **65.05** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2021 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **10**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **80%**: **20%**. Scores ranged from **45.44** – **79.82** (min and max possible were 16-100.4). Mean and median averages achieved were **60.11** and **58.96** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2021 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **18**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **78%**: **22%**. Scores ranged from **46.16** – **92.36** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **68.21** and **71.67** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2020 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **21**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **81%**: **19%**. Scores ranged from **34.4** – **95.3** (min and max possible were 16-100.4). Mean and median averages achieved were **67.92** and **71.2** respectively.






Due to the unprecedented circumstances surrounding the outbreak of COVID-19, the decision was made to cancel all remaining face to face interviews. This led to a revised scoring process being implemented which consisted of ranking candidates based on five domains from the self-assessment score that is used on the application form. Please note that the Final Score data and graphs for ST3 2020 R1 are reflective of the revised scoring process and thus should not be used to compare data in previous years. This scoring process was implemented as a result of the circumstances and therefore will not provide consistencies with data in previous years

The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed using the revised scoring process in 2020 ST3 recruitment round 1.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 28; the split of candidates who have met the threshold vs candidates who have not met the threshold was 79%: 21%. Scores ranged from 26 – 46 (min and max possible were 1-48). Mean and median averages achieved were 37.15 and 37.80 respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2019 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **15**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **93%**: **7%**. Scores ranged from **49.75** – **94.95** (min and max possible were **16-100**). Mean and median averages achieved were **79.77** and **79.90** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2018 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 18; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 89%: 11%. Scores ranged from 54.25 – 87.50 (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were 73.39 and 75.23 respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2017 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 24; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **88%**: **13%**. Scores ranged from **43.7** – **87.55** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **70.74** and **74.68** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2017 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 4; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **75%**: **25%**. Scores ranged from **53.15** – **77.25** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **66.66** and **68.13** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2016 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 27; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **100%**: **0%**. Scores ranged from **52.55** – **93.50** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **73.70** and **74.05** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2016 ST3 Recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 7; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **100%**: **0%**. Scores ranged from **60** – **84.65** (min and max possible were **16-99.5**). Mean and median averages were **74.22** and **76.7** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2015 ST3 recruitment round 1.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **26**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **85%**: **15%**. Scores ranged from **48.10** – **83.80** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **70** (70.40) and **74.00** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2015 ST3 recruitment round 2.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **4**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **75%**: **25%**. Scores ranged from **53.40** – **85.25** (min and max possible were **16**-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **65** (64.66) and **60.00** respectively.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **40**; the split of 'appointable' vs 'not-appointable' assessments was **95%**: **5%**. Scores ranged from **54.9-88.95** (min and max possible were **16**.0-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **71** (71.33) and **71.17** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2014 ST3 recruitment round 2.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **10**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **90%**: **10%**. Scores ranged from **57.95** – **89.95** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **75** (75.17) and **79.65** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **genitourinary medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2013 ST3 recruitment round 1.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **41**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **88%**: **12%**. Scores ranged from **38.45-93.75** (min and max possible were **16.0-99.5**). Mean and median averages achieved were **72** (71.85) and **72.1** respectively.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **8**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **87.5%**: **12.5%**. Scores ranged from **43.55** – **92.25** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **77** (77.49) and **81.3** respectively.
