

PHST palliative medicine recruitment – final assessment score distribution

The graphs within this document show the distribution of interview scores for PHST recruitment since 2013.

The scores are recorded for each candidate attending an interview, including those that were found not to be appointable.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here. See the pages below for the number of candidates, including the percentage of those deemed appointable and non-appointable, interviewed in each round of recruitment; the range of scores obtained and the mean and median scores achieved across all candidates.


Where details for a specific year or round are not included, this should be taken to mean that the specialty was not participating in a particular round or that the specialty at that point in time had not yet joined the nationally-coordinated recruitment process.



The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2025 ST4 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **99**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **85%:15%**. Scores ranged from **48 – 94.50** (min and max possible were **16-100**). Mean and median averages achieved were **73.83** and **76.50** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2024 ST4 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **19**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **89%:11%**. Scores ranged from **39.3** – **96.80** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **74.77** and **77.60** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2024 ST4 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **72**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **92%:8%**. Scores ranged from **37.3 – 94.0** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **74.95** and **75.90** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2023 ST4 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **15**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **93%:7%**. Scores ranged from **67 – 98.20** (min and max possible were **16-110**). Mean and median averages achieved were **79.33** and **79.40** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2023 ST4 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **52**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **96%:4%**. Scores ranged from **60.6 – 100.10** (min and max possible were 16-110). Mean and median averages achieved were **82.74** and **84.20** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2022 ST4 recruitment round 2.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **7**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **100%:0%**. Scores ranged from **70.75 – 100.55** (min and max possible were 16-110.3). Mean and median averages achieved were **84.11** and **83.85** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in PHST 2022 ST4 recruitment round 1.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **39**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **85%:15%**. Scores ranged from **46.25 – 102.05** (min and max possible were 16-110.3). Mean and median averages achieved were **77.57** and **77.65** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2021 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 22; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 59%:41%. Scores ranged from 35.02 – 87.20 (min and max possible were 16-100.4). Mean and median averages achieved were 61.86 and 60.52 respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2021 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **54**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **70%:30%**. Scores ranged from **35.4** – **90.44** (min and max possible were 16-100.4). Mean and median averages achieved were **65.60** and **67.31** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2020 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **30**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **93%:7%**. Scores ranged from **40.9 – 88.0** (min and max possible were 16-100.4). Mean and median averages achieved were **70.39** and **70.70** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed using at interview in 2020 ST3 recruitment round 1.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **97**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **92%**: **8%**. Scores ranged from **42 – 87.20** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **68.77** and **69.40** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2019 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **78**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **82%**: **18%**. Scores ranged from **27.20** – **91.00** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **66.09** and **66.90** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2018 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 77; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was 83%: 17%. Scores ranged from 24 – 85.40 (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were 64.86 and 65.40 respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2018 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 22; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **86%:14%**. Scores ranged from **36 – 80** (min and max possible were **16-100**). Mean and median averages achieved were **64.83** and **67.20** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2017 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 82; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **76%**: **24%**. Scores ranged from **27.4** – **87.0** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **64.61** and **65.7** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2017 ST3 recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 24; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **75%**: **25%**. Scores ranged from **27.60** – **84.60** (min and max possible were 16-100). Mean and median averages achieved were **63.38** and **64.50** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2016 ST3 recruitment round 1.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included here.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was 98; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **85%**: **15%**. Scores ranged from **46.80** – **86.90** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **68.59** and **68.68** respectively.






The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2016 ST3 Recruitment round 2.

All scores here have been rounded to the nearest whole number; and only those candidates who received both a score for their verified application form and performance at interview have been included.



The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2015 ST3 recruitment round 1.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **103**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **78%**: **22%**. Scores ranged from **42.45** – **90.80** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **67** (67.46) and **67.85** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2015 ST3 recruitment round 2.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **26**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **73%**: **27%**. Scores ranged from **42.05** – **89.75** (min and max possible were 16-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **69** (68.69) and **68.35** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to all candidates interviewed for ST3 palliative medicine posts in 2014 ST3 recruitment round 1.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **105**; the split of 'appointable' vs 'not-appointable' assessments was **84%**: **26%**. Scores ranged from **31.65-92.05** (min and max possible were 16.0-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **67** (67.11) and **68.15** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2014 ST3 recruitment round 2.


The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **18**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **56%**: **44%**. Scores ranged from **46.9** – **82.85** (min and max possible were **16**-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **65** (64.68) and **61.7** respectively.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **75**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **75%**: **25%**. Scores ranged from **46.6-92.15** (min and max possible were **16**.0-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **70** (69.75) and **69.4** respectively.





The graph below shows the distribution of final assessment scores awarded to **palliative medicine** candidates assessed at interview in 2013 ST3 recruitment round 2.

The number of applicants receiving a full assessment and final score was **31**; the split of appointable vs not-appointable assessments was **71%**: **29%**. Scores ranged from **30.05** – **89.70** (min and max possible were 16.0-99.5). Mean and median averages achieved were **69** (69.03) and **72.4** respectively.
